



Rules for Artist of the Month Contest



All artists who enter must have attended 3 General Meetings within the calendar year

One cannot take artwork from Critique and enter the piece into the show at the same meeting. A later meeting is fine.

- Dues cannot be outstanding.
- Paintings must be framed or Gallery-wrapped((at least 1 1/2" wide) and painted on all sides.
- If you win a 1st Place ribbon you cannot enter again until the next year.
- Artwork must be original, no "copies of the Old Master" or other works permitted.
- No wet paintings.

Sign in at the table, fill out a slip with TITLE and MEDIUM of the painting and the number assigned to you Display your work on the white clothed chairs in front of the stage with Title and number slip in front of your artwork.

Members who attended the General Meeting vote and a 1st, 2nd and 3rd Place ribbons will be awarded.

At the December meeting all 1st place winners will enter their artwork in the "Artist of the Year" contest.

An award will be given to the winner. Should you have sold the winning work, then please submit a similar painting for the December meeting. This contest will be judged by a committee selected by the Board and not the general membership.






















Westminster Village Show

- Work submitted after 6:15 may not be critiqued depending on volume of work.
- Work submitted for Critique cannot be submitted for artist of the month on the same evening.

About The Gratitude Project

The Gratitude Project is an exhibition of 6-inch x 6-inch floral-themed paintings by members of the Arizona Art Alliance. The theme of gratitude is represented by flowers as a way to acknowledge and thank Healthcare Workers during the time of Covid. It is customary to say thank you with flowers – what better way than with art!

The paintings will be on permanent and temporary display at central Arizona Health Care Facilities including Mayo Clinic, the Phoenix VA and Paradise Valley Community College School of Nursing. Other locations to be announced.

How to participate:

Canvases are available through the Arizona Art Alliance, and the participating arts organizations. You are welcome to use your own 6-inch x 6-inch inch canvas board. Any two-dimensional medium may be used to create a floral themed work of art.

Guidelines:

Each artist may donate multiple botanical or florals works of art on 6-inch x 6-inch canvas boards. Be sure to orient the canvas with the label on back. If your canvas does not have a label, be sure to include the information printed at left. Be sure to print legibly on the label, providing as much of the requested information as possible.

Canvases may be picked up and dropped off at the participating arts organizations, the Arizona Artists Guild or the Arizona Art Alliance.


